WHEREAS, the Holland Township Municipal Engineer requests a change order to be approved by the Township Committee at its regular meeting on February 2, 2016. This change order is listed below for your review and approval; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Township Engineer to award this change order to North American Pipeline Services, LLC and

WHEREAS, details of this change order are noted in the communications dated January 27, 2016, and is attached to the payment voucher; and

WHEREAS, the treasurer has certified that funds will be available in the Holland Township Sewer Utility Capital Ordinance for Repair to Sewer Lines; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of change orders is governed by *N.J.A.C.* 5:30-11.2-11.10; and

WHEREAS, the Holland Township Committee has been advised that the proposed change order will not cause the originally awarded contract price to be exceeded by more than 20 per cent; and

WHEREAS, the Holland Township Committee has been further advised that the need for the proposed change order results from an unforeseeable problem which cannot be addressed through public bidding without a substantial amount of the construction being delayed which would cause substantial inconvenience to the public; and

WHEREAS, the Holland Township Committee has been further advised that the proposed change order does not materially expand on the size, nature or scope of the project as described in the bid documents; and

WHEREAS, the Holland Township Committee has been further advised that the work represented by the proposed change order could not be performed through a separately bid contract without unduly disrupting the basic work or incurring adverse cost consequences; and

WHEREAS, the Holland Township Committee has concluded that the change order is necessary and the work will be completed.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Holland, Hunterdon County, New Jersey that Change Order #1 awarded to North American Pipeline Services, LLC.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a written amendment to the original contract with North American Pipeline Services, LLC; be prepared covering the change order, in a form acceptable to the Township attorney.

RESOLUTION

Authorizing Reduction of Performance Bond of Allen Blumberg Major Subdivision

WHEREAS, on July 14, 2003, the Planning Board of the Township of Holland (the "Board") granted Final Major Subdivision approval subject to certain conditions to Allen Blumberg (the "Developer") on property known as Block 1, Lots 5.05, 5.06, 5.07, 5.08, 5.09, 5.10, 5.11, 5.12, 5.13, 5.14, 5.15, 5.16, 5.17, 5.18 and 5.19 on the Tax Map of the Township of Holland, Hunterdon County, New Jersey (hereinafter the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Township Land Use Ordinances require a performance guarantee which the Township Engineer calculated to be \$1,147,981.20, 10% of which was to be a cash deposit (\$114,798.12) and the balance of which was to be a surety bond or letter of credit (\$1,033,183.08), and a deposit toward engineering inspection fees of \$47,832.55;

WHEREAS, the Developer has requested that the Township reduce the Performance Guarantee; and

WHEREAS, by memo dated January 29, 2016, the Township Engineer recommended reduction of the Performance Guarantee stating that the cost of the remaining improvements is \$604,033.00; and

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer further advised that the total Performance Guarantee could be reduced to \$724,839.60, with the cash portion being reduced to \$72,483.96.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Holland, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey hereby authorize a reduction of the Performance Guarantee of the Developer to the total amount of \$724,839.60, with the cash portion being reduced to \$72,483.96 for the Property based upon the recommendations of the Township Engineer and conditioned upon the receipt of a substituted performance guarantee in a form satisfactory to the Township Attorney.

-RESOLUTION-Gypsy Moth Control Program

RESOLUTION

Authorization to participate in the State of New Jersey Department of Agriculture Gypsy Moth Control Program

WHEREAS, the gypsy moth *Lymantria dispar*, has been found heavily defoliating tree and plant growth in the Township of Holland; and

WHEREAS, continued destruction of foliage may result in loss of valuable forest lands and trees; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Holland has determined that a gypsy moth control program should be instituted with the State of New Jersey Department of Agriculture and that application for any Federal or State funds available be authorized.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Holland, County of Hunterdon in the State of New Jersey, that the gypsy moth is declared to be a public nuisance and the protection of vegetation or plant life therefrom is deemed to be a subject matter of public welfare, and that all measures deemed necessary, in compliance with the State of New Jersey Department of Agriculture recommendations, is hereby authorized to suppress this forest and shade tree pest.

WHEREAS, this employee will be required to attend and pass all required training; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Holland Township Committee, Township of Holland, County of Hunterdon in the State of New Jersey, that Andrea Fox will be hired as Riegel Ridge

Community Center as Instructor at the 2016 rate of \$25.00 per/hr., contingent on favorable results of all required background checks, effective February 2, 2016.

ORDINANCE 2016-1

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$105,743.39.

FROM THE RESERVE FOR COMMUNITY CENTER RENOVATIONS \$55,543.39 AND RESERVE FOR IMPROVEMENTS AT THE RRCC \$50,000.00 IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HOLLAND, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$105,743.39 FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO THE RRCC. **BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Holland, in the County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION ONE: The sum of \$105,743.39 is hereby appropriated from the Reserve for Community

Center Renovations in the amount of \$55,543.39 and from the Reserve for Improvements at the RRCC \$50,000.00. In the General Capital Account, for Improvements to the RRCC in the Township in the amount of \$105,743.39.

SECTION TWO: The period of usefulness of the above project as defined by N.J.S.A. 40A:2-22 is

at least 5 years.

SECTION THREE: The capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform

with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Township Clerk and is available

for public inspection.

SECTION FOUR: The gross debt of the Township of Holland, as defined by N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 will

not be increased by this ordinance.

SECTION FIVE: The Township authorized the Chief Financial Officer to reimburse any funds

received for grants related to this project.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication, following final adoption, as provided by law.
